**Preschool Children and  
Students  
(Age 3 - 21 Years)**

If you are concerned that your preschool child or student is developing or learning differently, you can call East Windsor Regional School District, Student Services office to refer your child to the district's Preschool Child Study Team. Student Services personnel will answer any questions you may have.

If you would like to request an evaluation for special education and related services you will be advised to send a written request for an evaluation to the Preschool Child Study Team at the following address:

In this written request, include your child's name, age, address and suspected or known disability.

After receiving your request, the district's Preschool Child Study team has 20 days to have a meeting with you - the parent/guardian. At this meeting, you and the team will decide if an evaluation is needed and what the evaluation will include.

**Infants and toddlers  
(Birth to 3 years old)**

If you are concerned that your infant or toddler is developing or learning differently, you can call an Early Intervention Service Coordinator. The phone numbers are listed on the back of this pamphlet for Early Intervention Service Coordinators at the Special Child Health Service Case Management Unit (SCH-CMU) in your county.

**What happens when you call**

A service coordinator will listen to your concern and will describe services and other resources that may be available for your child and family.

The Early Intervention Service Coordinator may arrange for your child to have a developmental evaluation at no cost to you. This evaluation will determine if your child is eligible for Early Intervention Services.

Early Intervention Services can help families meet their child's developmental needs.

Early Intervention Services are provided to children:

- within their natural environments (the home and community)
- in settings which children without disabilities participate
- with active participation of families

**For Preschool Children  
and Students  
(Ages 3 to 21)**
